We appreciate all of the individuals and groups that are helping us care for children across South Carolina. Below are just a few things you can do to help us too.



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


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Christ-centered Quality Care

Connie Maxwell Children's Home has a long-established history of caring for children and their families, and has continued to develop new programs with individualized services that provide stability and Christ-centered support during their time of need. Connie Maxwell has five campus locations across S.C., and is accredited by the Council on Accreditation (COA). Each year, more than 200 children and their families participate in one of our core programs: residential care, crisis care, family care and foster care. Crisis Care

Connie Maxwell Children's Home has emergency cottages available on the Greenwood and Chesterfield campuses that are open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. They accept school-aged children and teens who need immediate, short-term relief from a difficult situation. Many of the

same recreational activities as our residential care program are offered to provide children in our care a rich and full life.

AT A GLANCE:

- Emergency or crisis placements for up to 90 days
- Immediate needs of food, clothing, shelter, medical, and schooling met
- Counseling provided
- Can accommodate school-aged children



Residential Care

Residential Care is the heart of our ministry at Connie Maxwell and provides children with a safe, secure, loving and Christian environment. Sometimes families need a "home away from home" where their children can be cared for while they face temporary challenges. This is exactly what our residential care program offers. Each child's physical, emotional and spiritual needs are met by trained, compassionate caregivers, and families can rest assured that their children are well cared for while they work through their challenging circumstances.

AT A GLANCE:

- Roomy, family-style homes with live-in staff
- Children attend school and participate in extracurricular activities
- Homework center and tutoring available
- Intensive programs are offered to strengthen the relationship between child and family
- A Comprehensive Care Plan is established with each family
- Each child receives Independent Living training beginning at age 13
- Can accommodate school-aged children
- Level 1 (Low Management) care



Post-graduation Support

Through the generosity of caring individuals and alumni, there are a number of support funds available to high school graduates that are transitioning to Independent Living from Connie Maxwell Children's Home. Higher Education Scholarships: A scholarship program for college, technical or vocational-bound students who graduate from Connie Maxwell Children's Home. In addition to monetary support, assistance is provided with course scheduling, and housing during school breaks.

Student Transitional Assistance Fund: The STAF fund was established by Connie Maxwell alumni, along with other family and friends and provides transitional assistance to deserving students who have graduated high school and are preparing to enter an institution of higher learning or the workplace. This fund helps cover a variety of expenses such as housing, transportation, insurance, and utility deposits.

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Family Care

Family Care exists to restore families in our community with hope, comfort, and shelter while they locate the resources they need to move toward independent living. This program equips single parents from all walks of life so they can focus on resolving their individual crisis and temporary family instability.

AT A GLANCE:

- Life skills classes and parenting workshops offered
- Individualized goal setting
- Individual/group counseling and vocational assistance provided
- Financial education
- Spiritual guidance
- Support is provided during transition to independent living
- Aftercare services for up to 12 months



Foster Care

Being a foster parent is a vital ministry to precious children who often come from tragic circumstances. Our mission is to provide safe, loving homes for children in need by connecting South Carolina churches and Christian families with community partners. Opportunities for respite care and resource families to support our residential children and foster families are also available.
